The motifs are done with needle-turn applique and the quilting by hand.



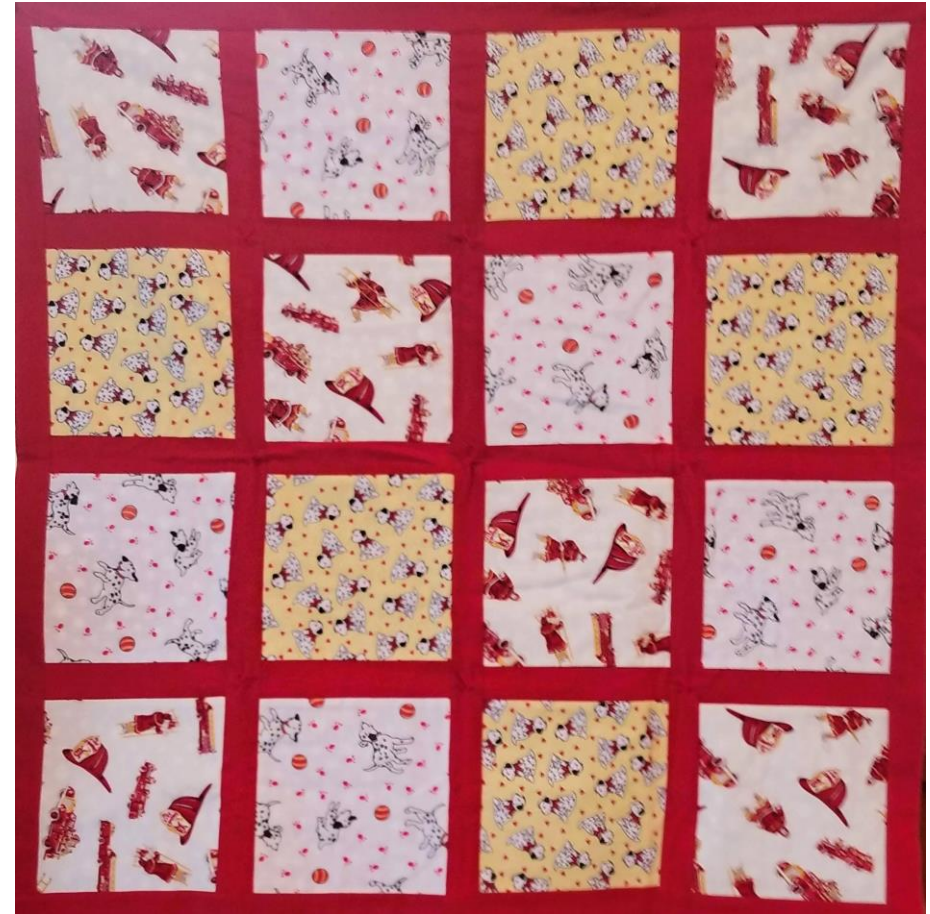

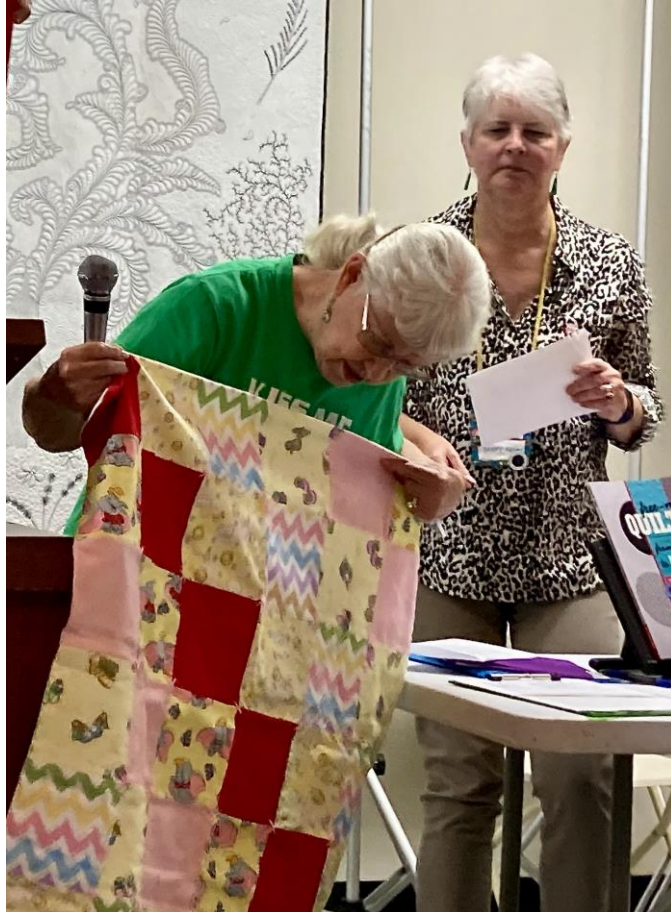
