I made two different small blocks in Mini Maniacs and used them in this quilt. Loved Edyta Sitar's Open Vine & Berries and used this design for the border.



This pattern is called "A Gathering" by Barbara Persing. I did it in needle turn applique.



From a workshop with Pam Hadfield. I reduced the size so that I could hang the quilt in my house.




Maddie Vansell Snowball
