

Council is seeking nominations for VP Membership, Parliamentarian, and Treasurer. Insurance applications are closing, SQG's insurance is in good standing. Future meeting topics were announced and include; fund raisers, membership involvement, and philanthropy.



The Block of the Month is on vacation in August when we have the presentation of the Everything Old is New Again Challenge Quilts.

If you would like to participate in the September Block of the Month exchange for the Take Me 4 a Spin block, bring your block(s) to the September meeting (turn in one block or more to go into a drawing to win all the turned in blocks!) You might be lucky.

The blocks for the last two months are available in the last 2 newsletters if you haven't tried them yet. Pinwheels? Orange peels? Diamonds? Try something new.

**TAKE ME 4 A SPIN** This pinwheel block with a 3D effect will make any quilt more fun. It can be made in any size, since all squares used are the same size.

For our block:

4 4" squares, print cotton, fun red (or white or blue print) stripes are especially nice

4 4" squares, cotton, blue solid, to contrast

Coordinating thread, cotton.

Press 4 red (or white or blue print) squares diagonally in half, right sides out.

Line up 4 blue squares, right sides up.

Place red (or white or blue print) triangles on top of blue squares, matching cut edges, across the lower right corner.

All triangles should be in the same position.

Take the top red (or white or blue print) corner of the triangle on right hand side of the block and fold it in half, back on itself, bring the point to the bottom right corner. Pin.

Repeat for all four squares.



Baste. Using a 1/8" seam, sew folded triangle points with basting stitch on all squares.

Spin the squares to have the folded corners pointing to the center to look like a pinwheel.

Sew block. Using 1/4" seams, make 2 matching sets of two, then sew sets together, matching center point.

\* Hint. This is a bulky block, so 3 or 4 machine stitches in the center where the seams nest can hold better than a pin. Check your center. If perfect, proceed. If not, redo.

Press. These block seams will have a preferred direction to lie due to the extra fabric.

**No August Show & Tell.** Bring your Show & Tell items in September.



**Susie Russell** presented "Hope Blooms". She saw the pattern at Road2CA 2016 and fell in love with the soft colors and pattern. She made her version using nine blocks of the original twelve block pattern. Her quilt will be a wall hanging or draped on a quilt rack. It is completely hand appliqued and hand quilted. She used the freezer paper method of appliqué. Each appliqued piece is outlined in hand quilting. Then four quilt blocks are echo quilted and the remaining are hand quilted in half inch grid. The border is hand quilted using echo quilting as well as a one inch grid. The quilt took her a year to complete.




"USA" by **Linda Walters**. Patriotic sampler with USA label. Industrial quilting with perle cotton.



**Maggie Bell** made "Patriotic Conversion" for herself in 2010 using a pattern from Ricky Tims. Idea from similar wall hanging made by Marianne Cunningham of BCQG. Starburst quilting done with silver metallic thread.




“Chenille Cat” was made by **Ursula Hartunian** from a Quilt Cupboard kit. There are three layers of fabric, sewn every half inch on a diagonal, then cut between the stitching lines. A trip to the washer and dryer and Viola! - a chenille cat.



**Elizabeth Geer** 's friend Pat Minnesang showed her this quilt. Forty years ago when Pat taught 2nd grade, her students painted these squares for a 1776 Liberty quilt. Even though she didn't sew, Pat and a friend managed to make a quilt out of them.




“Speedy Recovery” shown by **Vickie Janis**. A good friend is on a list for a lung transplant and she thought he needed a cozy quilt for his recovery time - six weeks at UCLA. She transferred photos to fabric, quilted a fishy theme since Gary has owned several boats including charters out of LA and San Diego. Lots of prayers went into this quilt asking God to watch over Gary until the lung is in place and working.





**Lynn Tweet** made this table runner from the July Block of the Month pattern. It was a new technique in reverse appliqué for her and she found it to be fun.




**Candy Martin** showed her "Vintage Butterflies" quilt. She was given the butterfly blocks by **Jan Hirth** and this is what she created with them. The quilt will go to her granddaughter Isla.



"Reef's Quilt" **Candy Martin** made this quilt for her grandson Reef and will give it to him for his sixth birthday.



**Carol Devino** showed her “Spider Web” pillow which she made in **Jean Impey’s** workshop after her presentation at Beach Cities Quilters Guild in June. Jean has worked out a great process for making the spider web design.



**Margaret Shea** shared her quilt “Love From Above”. Margaret has an anxiety disorder and her therapist encourages her to quilt. All of a sudden she started noticing small giraffe figurines appearing on the shelves and tables in her office. She told Margaret that she admires giraffes for their maternal instincts and that they always appear gentle, quiet, and calm. 


