



December Program: Our Own Victoria Crayne & friend, Marty Boles

I grew up designing and redesigning fashion - first for dolls and then for myself. Creating without a pattern has been my way of work. I continue today; my latest an interpretation is Legends of Uluru (Ayres Rock in Australia).

I started creating art quilts in 2004. Many of them are interpretations of famous paintings. I am challenged to create, with textiles, thread and embellishments, the essence the original artist was trying to express.

In my nature art quilts I am trying to express not only the visual image, but the temperature, scent, and sounds. Growing up in rural Michigan with a family who drove off-road, between the trees, to find a camp site, I experienced the sounds and silence of the woods and water. My father was an Algonquin (a Native American tribe found in Michigan) who found his way by the moss growing on trees and the direction of the wind and water. Searching for animal tracks and birds nests and edible fruits and berries were some of my first lessons in wilderness survival. Bringing these elements to my art quilts presents a wonderful challenge.



My heritage art quilts stem from a 39-year search for my family's history, with a growing appreciation and respect for those writings and heirlooms left behind. My yo yo memory album, designed to share the life of my grandmother Etta Lenore Parker, has created quite a stir. My quilt for late race car driver Phil Hill brought him great pleasure when it was presented to him at a 80th birthday party hosted by Jay Leno. I was honored to create such a special quilt.

Suddenly, I have been challenged to add traditional quilting to my repertoire, New York Beauty, paper piecing, stack, slash and shuffle, flying geese, and prairie points to name a few.



During the 30 years that Lyn Mann has been quilting she has finished over 500 quilts and wall hangings. She has taught all over the country and on seven quilting cruises. In 1998, Lyn was the featured artist for the Christmas exhibit at the La Conner Quilt Museum in La Conner, WA.



She has had quilts published in five different books as well as six quilting magazines. A class at Lyn's house called "No Such Thing As An Ugly Fabric" was filmed and aired as a lead-in to a "Simply Quilts" episode. She has also written eight "Slick Trick" articles for *Quilters Newsletter Magazine*. She has designed more than 80 original quilts for mysteries and readily admits to being an avid "fabricoholic" with scrap quilts being her favorites. Voting shall be at the April meeting. Term of office shall be for one year for elected officers. No officer shall be eligible for the same office for more than two years.

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Introducing...Bev Weibel

Bev was raised on a farm in East San Diego County. Her mother made all her play clothes out of feed sacks; she fondly remembers going to the granary with her father and picking out the sacks she wanted to wear. When she was a little girl, her aunt bought her a tiny sewing machine that she used to make doll clothes. As she got older, she began using her mother's machine and sewed most of her own clothes, including her school formals, then her children's clothing and costumes. She was recognized as being proficient and was enlisted by some of her daughter's high school friends' mothers to teach their daughters to sew.



While attending high school in San Diego, Bev met her husband-to-be. They married in 1956 and moved to Tyler, Texas for five years. They then moved to Capo Beach, where they've lived ever since. During her working career, she worked in administration at South Coast Hospital for three years, then for physicians in private practice for 24 years, mostly in billing.

Just before she retired in 1993, Bev purchased some quilt books and became interested. Then after retirement, she started taking classes from Suzanne Stanton and seriously got started. She loves all kinds of fabric, but her favorite is the reproduction prints - in fact, all of the bed quilts in her house are made of these fabrics.

Currently Bev's making a quilt for each of her seven nieces and nephews. She says it takes her *forever* to finish each one. She used to hand quilt all her quilts, but has now joined many of us who send them out for quilting.

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December Block of the Month

Let's give our PieceMaker thread for her quilts. December is always such a busy month, but you will find these are SEW EASY to make. You will need to make three sets of two spools.

Remember that you will have two chances to win \$100 prizes. If you make the 12 blocks and put them into a top, you may win the \$100 raffle in July. If you complete the quilt with batt, backing, binding, and sleeve, your quilt will be displayed at our BOM show in July. You may win \$100 and a Viewers' Choice ribbon and possibly the raffle too.

While you must include all 12 blocks June to May, you choose your own colors, fabrics, setting, whether to add sashing or borders, and you may change the block size.

Create **three** units of **two** spools



Each unit of two spools should measure 3 1/2" x 6 1/2"

Scrap by making each spool from different fabrics

For one spool unit of two spools

1. A Cut two background 3 1/2" x 1"
use two different fabrics
2. B Cut four background 1" x 2"
using the same two different fabrics
3. C Cut four spool top/bottoms 3 1/2" x 1"
use two different fabrics
4. D Cut two thread portions 2 1/2 x 2"
use two different fabrics
5. Sew B to both sides of D
Press towards D
6. Sew one C to the top
and one C to the bottom of BDB
Press towards C
7. Sew one A to top of BBDCC
8. Repeat to make a second spool
9. Sew the two spools together to make one unit
of two spools
10. Make two more units of two spools
