

# **January Workshop**

## Wednesday, January 10, 2024 Heidi Stagno

Hand Guided Free-Motion Quilting Sampler
Level #1





**Description:** *This is a technique workshop.* Join Heidi Stagno and learn how to create beautiful quilting designs that enhance your quilt top, by mixing rulers, feathers, and background fills.

**#1 Ruler Work**...Using rulers when quilting creates a beautiful framework for the texture and movement. Ruler work gives structure and purpose to the placement of all other quilting. In this class you will learn: how to properly hold and position rulers, how to mark your quilt for ruler placement, and how to maintain control of the ruler and machine to achieve precise quilting lines.

**#2 Feathers**...Feathers are the main characters in any quilt. The feathers will steal the show and make any quilt extra special. In this class you will learn: basic feather formation, how to quilt a multi-directional feather, and symmetrical plume size and shape.

#3 Background Fills...Background fills are the staple when custom quilting. It is last, but not least, when it comes to choosing the quilting designs for your quilt top. The purpose of the background fills is to showcase the featured quilting designs and support the definition of the ruler work. In this class you will learn: how to create a curling background fill to be used at any scale, how to fill a negative space with a systematic approach but looks random, and how to flip and rotate a design to give movement and fluidity to the quilt.

**Pattern:** There is no pattern required.

**Supply List:** Pick up a copy of the supply list when you register. Note: Heidi will have supplies and practice quilt sandwiches available for purchase if you don't want to prepare your own.

**Description:** Magical Mandalas is an adventure in ice dyeing. Each student will fold, pleat, and bind 9 different 22" x 22" mandalas, each uniquely individual. Cindy Lohbeck's skill builder approach will leave you with an understanding of the nature of ice dyeing, as well as a beautiful stash! Each student will receive a reusable tool kit so the fun can continue at home!

**Kit:** There is a required kit that you will purchase from Cindy for \$75. The kit includes high quality PFD (Prepared for Dyeing) fabric, a choice of dye colorway, mixing cups, measuring cups, spoons, funnel, squeeze bottles, and Cindy's awesome Ice Dyeing Flexi-Net. You will need to provide a plastic tote with lid.

# **Parliamentarian - Debbie Myers**

Surfside Quilters Guild members will be asked to approve changes to the Guild's Bylaws at the January 9, 2024, General Meeting. The executive board duties of the 3rd Vice President, Facilities will be expanded.

#### **Article IV - EXECUTIVE BOARD & DUTIES, Section 7:**

#### **Currently reads:**

The 3rd Vice President (Facilities) shall serve as the Guild's liaison officer and meeting site manager. The 3rd Vice President shall also be responsible for maintaining equipment and continuously updating records of all equipment and articles other than any library materials. The records identify the location, use, warranties and operating instructions. Guild equipment is to be used for Guild functions only.

#### Change to:

The 3rd Vice President (Facilities) shall serve as the Guild's liaison officer and meeting site manager. They shall be responsible for negotiating and maintaining contracts and insurance for guild meeting sites (general meeting, workshops, philanthropy and special events).

The 3rd Vice President shall also be responsible for maintaining equipment and continuously updating records of all equipment and articles, other than library

materials. The records identify the location, use, warranties and operating instructions. Guild equipment is to be used for Guild functions only.

#### **Article XI - AUTHORITY, Section 4:**

#### **Currently reads:**

All contracts of the Guild, except for speakers, must be approved by the Board prior to signature and must be signed by the President and the applicable chairperson. The 1st Vice President, Programs, shall be responsible for speakersworkshop contracts.

#### Change to:

All contracts of the Guild, except for speakers and facilities, must be approved by the Board prior to signature and must be signed by the President and applicable chairperson. The 1st Vice President, Programs, shall be responsible for speakersworkshop contracts. The 3rd Vice President, Facilities, shall be responsible for facilities contracts.

#### Reason for the change:

During the past few years, Surfside Quilters Guild has had to move its location several times—necessitating additional rental contracts and insurance policies. The proposed change better describes the 3rd Vice President, Facilities actual duties.

One of the nicer traditions of Surfside Quilters Guild is to present a quilt to the out-going President at the end of her term.

Please consider making a block for Mary's President's Quilt. Pick up a copy of the flyer with a 6 1/2 inch square of background batik fabric at the January Meeting. Details follow.

**Theme:** Wine & Quilting

**Colors:** Mary has chosen Hoffman's batik, 581 Bluegrass, for the <u>block</u> <u>background</u>. Attached is a 6 1/2 square of this fabric. I have more if needed.

**Block ideas:** quilting notions such as pincushion, iron, sewing machine, etc. or wine glass, wine cork, wine label, grapes, etc.—use your imagination or google: **wine quilts or quilting notions** on your phone or computer. Any technique is acceptable. Please make sure embellishments are securely attached.

Block size: 5 inch finished; we will trim the block to 5 1/2

**inches.** Please keep your design within the 5 inch area—we don't want to have to cut off your work.

**Signature:** Sign your block within the 5"x5" space; I'll have a pen at the meeting.

**Due date:** I will collect blocks at the January, February, and March Guild meetings. **Final date is March 12, 2024, Guild Meeting.**

**BLOCK OF THE MONTH - Mary Arter** 

**January Block** 

> Family Block of the Month: Baskets Block 9

January 10" finished block


Basket: Cutting: Cut (2) 2 1/2" squares (yellow).

Background: Cut (1) 3 1/2" square (yellow). Cut (1) 2 1/2" square. Cut (3) 3 1/2" squares (blue). Cut (3) 3 1/2" squares. Cut (1) 3 1/2" square (red). Cut (2) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.

Cut (2) 2 1/2" squares (red). Cut (2) 4 1/2" squares. Cut (1) 5 1/2" square (red). Cut (1) 5 1/2" square (pink).

# Sewing:

<u>Handle</u> Draw a diagonal line on the back of each 3 1/2" background square, then draw a line 1/4" to each side. These are the sewing lines. Pair background squares with two blue and one yellow 3 1/2" square. With right sides together, sew along the two outer line, then cut along the center line. Press to the dark to form (6) half square triangle units. Trim to 2 1/2" square. Sew together to form two sets for the handles (watch the placement!).



Draw the diagonal lines on the pink 5 1/2" square. Pair with the red 5 1/2" square, sew, press and trim to 4 1/2" for (2) half square triangle units. You will only use one.

Draw the diagonal lines on the blue 3 1/2" square. Pair with the red 3 1/2" square, sew, press and trim to 2 1/2" for (2) half square triangle units.

Sew a yellow 2 1/2" square to the blue side of the red/blue half square triangle units, watching placement.

Sew these two units to the pink/red HST, following the diagram at the right. Draw ONE diagonal line on the back of the 4 1/2" background squares. Match the square with the two yellow squares so the diagonal lines runs corner to blue corner. Sew on the diagonal line, then trim to a 1/4" seam and press.

#### Base

Sew the two 2 1/2" red squares to the end of each of the 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" background rectangles. Press to the background - this will help in the final step!)

#### Basket Assembly

Sew the shorter handle piece to one side of the body, making sure the half square triangles are going the right direction.

Sew the longer handle piece to the other side, lining up your seam intersection where it meets the other handle piece.

Sew the two base rectangle/square segments to either side of the basket.

Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 4 1/2" square. Align the diagonal with the corners of the red squares that form the base of the basket. This is where pressing to the

background helps - you need to line up with the edge of the square in the seam allowance. Sew on the diagonal line (be careful to match the seam instersection point on the other side!) and trim to a 1/4" seam. Press to the background if it's dark enough to hide the colored fabrics, otherwise press to the colors.






















### 2023-2024 Block of the Month **Basket Collection**

Join us and make a collection of baskets designed by Sandi Walton of Piecemeal Quilts. The nine blocks (each is 10" square finished) are pieced, then combined with sashing and borders for a completed lap-size quilt (about 42 in. square). If you don't want to make the entire quilt, make just a few blocks for a cute table runner. You can combine four blocks for a 20-inch pillow top or make a single block for a small pillow or a mini quilt suitable for hanging. The finished quilt would also make a great donation to Philanthropy. See Mary Arter's Quilt above ... finished, quilted, bound!

Choose your own adventure with your fabric choices: traditional prints, modern bright colors, red/green for a Christmas theme, red/white/blue for a patriotic quilt, or make it totally scrappy.



The Blocks: Every month from June through March (except November), directions for a new basket block will be published in the Guild newsletter and on the website, and it will be available as a hard copy at the Guild meeting. Also in March, I will have directions for sashing, cornerstones, and border. Use the month of April to get caught up and to quilt and bind your project. In May, bring your quilt top (doesn't need to be quilted), table runner, pillow, or whatever to the Guild meeting to show and for a chance to win a prize.

**Fabric Requirements:** To make the complete quilt, using the colors in Sandi's directions, you will need:

- --1 yard background fabric
- --1 fat quarter EACH of blue, yellow, green, pink, and red fabrics
- --Small quantities of light pink, dark pink, light blue, and dark blue (these are used in only one or two blocks)
- --1 yard sashing/border fabric (I used the same as my block background fabric)
- --1 fat quarter for cornerstones

**Used with permission:** Copyright: This is pretty common sense stuff. Do not mass produce and sell quilts made from my patterns. Print a free pattern in its entirety as many times as you like and share it with your friends or guild. 
