Her projects come fast and furious, including swaps, mysteries, reproduction, and contemporary with a little bit of art thrown in.



Lyn is in demand as a guest speaker and teacher for quilt guilds all over southern California. Sharing quilts and secrets, Lyn brings a whole trunk show of quilts with her and her workshops are filled with quick techniques and sneaky tricks.

Before discovering quilting, Lyn ran her own publishing company, writing and publishing Personalized Romance Novels. She was even written up in *USA Today!* And before that, she

worked in her dad's engineering firm where they sold steam control equipment to the likes of the US Navy and Edison.

Somehow, Lyn is always doing something to generate warmth...but it is with quilting she has found her heart.







Introducing...Fern Luhn

Fern grew up surrounded by hand-sewn quilts. She remembers playing beneath her mother's quilt frame as the Ladies Aide Society quilted - a cozy playhouse walled by their legs. She has taken many quilting classes, most from our Guild's own Suzanne Stanton and Jan Hirth, and many close friendships have been forged stemming from her love of quilts.



Hawaiian quilts are especially beloved by Fern, and she enjoys hand quilting. She also greatly appreciates Asian fabrics, but finds most of them so beautiful she doesn't want to cut into them!

When she's not quilting, Fern enjoys reading and gardening. She has a menagerie consisting of several desert tortoises, one Russian tortoise, and an orange tabby cat that keeps her company while she's quilting by curling up on the work in progress.

Fern was raised on a fifth-generation farm in Kansas, where wheat, corn, oats, and alfalfa were grown. Since she was the oldest child, she was responsible for milking the cows, helping with harvesting the crops, and weeding the garden. Until she was in high school, her home did not have indoor plumbing or electricity, and kerosene lamps illuminated the family's evening activities. She had to walk one mile to and from school (but not uphill both ways!) to attend a one-room school that included eight grades.

When she was 18, she moved to Independence, Missouri, where she worked as a bookkeeper. When she married, she moved to Colorado for several years until 1960, when she and her husband moved to California for her husband's health. Together they had three sons and three daughters, resulting in five grandchildren and one great-grandchild. Happily, these offspring all live within 200 miles.

Fern has more stories about what she calls "the old-fashioned days" and would enjoy sharing them with you, so look for her at the next Guild meeting.





President's Quilt Presentation

What a joy to complete and present our Guild gift quilt to Sharon Whelan. Sharon served as Program Vice President our inaugural year and continued as President so well. We all thank her with this quilt, made with appreciation, love and respect.



DESIGN AND LOGO: I started last fall by consulting with Sharon on theme, color and overall size and with Jan Hirth and Lyndy Dye on block size and patterns. The design team of Maggie Bell, Nancy Bloyer, Judy Dunlap, Jan Hirth, Barbara McFarland, Odette Osantowski, and Barbara Seidel were a decisive group, making the design decisions in less than an hour. Jan Hirth hand appliquéd the logo landscape and I did the letters.

BLOCKS: In December, Sue Richardson, Marcia Faultersack and Jean Bull collected blocks, many using patterns we designed and printed specifically for this quilt. In all, 144 blocks were completed by our members. The blocks were trimmed to size by Nancy Bloyer, Carol Whiteside, Barbara Seidel, Maggie Bell, Joann Bishop, Mary Freedman, Janis Schonfeld, Hiroko Moriwaki, Sheri Hill, and me.

ASSEMBLING: Mary Freedman opened her home for us to sew. Placing,

pinning, sewing, and pressing at Mary's studio were Odette Osantowski, Joann Bishop, Hiroko Moriwaki, Mary Freedman, Marjie Butterworth, Judy Dunlap, Janis Schonfeld, Jane Salem, Barbara McFarland, Maggie Bell, and I. Nancy Bloyer, Becky Reed, Barbara Ann Christensen, Sharon Dowlan, and Mary and I basted and put the quilt on the frame on loan from Nancy Bloyer.



QUILTING: We had seven quilting bees at the homes of Nancy Bloyer, Barbara Trullis, Nafsi Martin, Connie Veldkamp, Sheri Hill, Maggie Bell, and Carol Whiteside. Sharon Dowlan helped move the quilt and frame and Mimi Harris helped with the binding.

Block of the Month: Calendar of Houses

JULY - BLOCK NO. 2 - THE WHITE HOUSE

Unfinished Block Size 12 ½" x 12 ½"

Materials "Let the Fabric Do The Work"

Background Sky and Ground: 1 fat quarter
 House: 1 fat quarter
 Windows, Columns, Door, Pediment, etc: Scraps
 Fusible Web

Using Background Sky and Ground Fabric

Cut 1 of each: 4 ½" x 13"

Using House Fabric

Cut 2: 4 ½" x 5"
 Cut 4: 1" x 5"

Using Scraps for Columns

Cut 4: 1" x 5"

Using Scraps for Windows

Cut 12: 1 ¼" x ½"

Using Scraps for Door and Center Window Area

For door, cut 1: 3 ½" x 1 ½"
 For house fabric between window and door, cut 1: 1" x 1 ½"
 For house fabric above window, cut 1: 1 ¼" x 1 ½"
 For window, cut 1: 1" x 1 ½"

Using Scraps for Horizontal Header on House

Cut 1 strip: 1 ¼" x 13"

Using House Fabric for Roof Cornices (A)


Cut 1: 1 ¼" x 8"

Using Background Sky Fabric (B)

Cut 1 - 4 ½" x 13"
 ♦ Center (B) on bottom edge of (A) per diagram and sew along bottom edge.
 ♦ Appliqué remaining three sides of (B) onto (A).

Using Scraps for Pediment (Low Triangle on Top of Building)

Cut 1: 2 ½" x 6 ½" Fold in half widthwise then cut diagonally from top middle to bottom outside edge thus forming low triangle.
 Cut 2: 1 ¼" x 6" strips and sew to top of low triangle. Miter points.



Assembly

- ♦ Construct house units per diagram.
- ♦ Sew 1 ¼" x 13" horizontal header to top of above constructed unit.
- ♦ Center low triangle onto bottom edge of (A/B) sky background. Appliqué.
- ♦ Sew background ground to house unit. Press. Square up to 12 ½ x 12 ½".

Additional Suggestions

- ♦ Embellish with fused or appliquéd flower beds, shrubbery, flag, fountain, people, front steps, etc.


