Introducing Helen Young Frost

This introduction is in Helen’s own words. “I began quilting in the early 1970s when all-cotton fabrics were few and far between and most were garish calicoes in red, blue, and yellow. Except for a couple of new quilt books, quilters had to rely on reprints from the 1930s for their patterns. Templates were made from graph paper glued to poster board. All pieces were cut with scissors.



But oh how exciting! The Bicentennial was coming and women wanted to make quilts! Not long after I began quilting, I began teaching a quilt-as-you-go sampler quilt for adult education in Southern California. My mother, Blanche Young, and I developed some innovative strip-piecing methods for the Lone Star, Sunshine & Shadow, and Trip Around the World quilts. We published several books on these techniques in the late 70s and early 1980s. We soon were teaching all over the country at guilds and conferences.

All these years later, I am still making Lone Star variations, still fascinated by the design potential. I’m also still in love with the Sunshine & Shadow pattern and its symmetry. Another long-time love is hand appliqué. My response to the tragic events of September 11, 2001 was to spend the next year designing and making a Revolutionary War alphabet quilt. Each person, event, or symbol depicted on my quilt, American Primer, reaffirms that the spirit of 1776 continues today.

I make a lot of quilts to warm the body, as shown by the quilts on all the beds in my home, but I find the most joy in making quilts that warm the heart.”

Achieve smooth bindings with perfect corners and learn a great method for joining the ends. Practice sewing angled and scalloped edges and try new "gourmet" bindings, such as two-color and faux piping. You will bind small pieces of pre-quilted fabrics to put in a "binding binder," a portfolio of sample bindings that you can refer to again and again. There is a kit fee of \$5.00 payable to the Instructor at the Workshop.








BLOCK OF THE MONTH SCRAPPY PINWHEELS JULY 2012





Make 10 pinwheels


- Cut 5 different light strips, 2 1/2" x 11"
Cut 5 different medium to dark strips, 2 1/2" x 11"
- Pair one light strip with one medium to dark strip, right sides together (You will have 5 pairs)
- On wrong side of the lightest strip, draw lines with pencil every 2 1/2" going the short direction
Then draw diagonal lines as shown.




- Sew 1/4" on both sides of drawn diagonal lines.




- Cut on drawn vertical and diagonal lines
- Press towards the dark
Square up each unit to 2" x 2"
You should have 8 units for each pair of fabrics




- Layout pinwheel sets
Sew two together, press towards the dark



- Sew two together, press towards the dark



- Complete the unit by sewing the two rows matching the center



- If you remove the stitches in the seam in the very center, the center fans out
You can press the seam, one to one side and the other to the other side, making the center flat
You should have ten 3 1/2" pinwheel blocks
- Sew two sets of five pinwheels.
