2025 Surfside Challenge – Let's Face It!

Let's Face It – We sure hope you are almost done with your Challenge project. It is due at the July Guild Meeting. If you are unable to turn it in on that date – be sure to let Janis Toman or Jan Hirth know – so that we can make arrangements for you to turn in your entry. Please remember to turn in your entry form with your challenge item. And remember to attach the cute little charm to your project. If you need a new form or charm –

we will have a few available at the July Guild Meeting.

Rules – Challenge entries can be a wall-sized quilt, garment, or decorative item. The perimeter of a quilt entry MUST measure at least 48 inches but not exceed 144 inches. You must use the equivalent of a 4x4 inch piece of one challenge fabric of your choice and a 2x2 inch piece of the remaining two challenge fabrics, visible on the front of your entry excluding the binding. You may add as many other fabrics and/or embellishments to your entry as you wish. The clock charm included in the kit must be sewn on the front of your entry. Original designs are not a requirement. All entries must have a label on the back. It should include the Title of the Entry and Name of the maker. Sleeves are not required as quilts will be pinned for display. Submission of the challenge entry gives permission for the entry to be photographed and for that photograph to be included in the newsletter and/or other medium.

- Best Original Design
- Best Us of a Traditional Block
- Best Non-quilt Entry
- Best Use of Challenge Fabrics
- Best Use of Embellishments
- Best Hand Applique

You can build your own hillside in one of three sizes: $60" \times 70"$ throw ... $30" \times 37"$ wall hanging ... $15" \times 18"$ mini quilt. There will be 18 houses divided into 12 individual blocks. Please reference the pattern to help with the shading and transitioning

between houses. A coloring page is included to help plan your design.

Fat quarters or scraps are recommended for the two smaller sizes.

Things you need to know:

- Each letter for the pieces represents a certain size block. They will be repeated for the left and right sides of the house.
 House numbers (ex. House #1) is on a coloring sheet available in PDF

 Right sides together is (RST)

 When cutting your squares in half to make half-square triangles (hsts),
 e any leftover halves for future blocks.
 Square assembled hat to:
 * 5 1/2in sq (throw size)

 ** 3 in sq (wall-hanging size)

- *** 1 3/4in sq (mini size)

Window Units:

To make one window unit, sew an (I) to each of the short sides of (E). Then sew a (D) to each of the sides of both (I) pieces. Press open

Make 2 for the left side of the house, and 2 for the right side. (4 total)



Roof:


To make the roof, gather and arrange your (F) hsts and (G) pieces.

After you have arranged your pieces, start assembling your hsts. Sew two hsts (RSTs) along the diagonal edge. Press open and square to *, **, or ***.




Sew (F) and (G) pieces together to create the roof.






Sew an (H) to each side of (J). Press.



Assemble the left and right sides of the roof to the top




Pattern Instructions Note

- 2. Adjust completed window sections by centering to the adjacent top and/or bottom piece and trim ends as needed.

We have kits ready to sew for quilt tops and pillowcases. Philanthropy will provide batting, backs, and binding. We have many beautiful colors to choose from.










Monthly Mini - Katy Lillie & Judy Nunn




