**Description:** This workshop introduces you to both thread painting and thread sketching. A preprinted design easily guides you through each step to assure your success right from the start. You will be amazed at how straight and zigzag stitches create magic right before your eyes. Plus, the process is easy and great fun.

**Kit:** You will buy a kit from Nancy for \$29, which includes 2 printed designs on stabilizer and 2 pieces of stabilizer backing.

## BOM for 2025-2026 Hillside Houses







Please reference the pattern to help with the shading and transitioning between houses. A coloring page is included to help plan your design.

Fat quarters or scraps are recommended for the two smaller sizes.







#### The Panguitch Quilt Walk Story

In June I'm always reminded of the true story of how quilts saved the lives of starving families. It was in the 1860's when a group of Pioneers settled in Panguitch, Utah. It gets really cold in the winters there and winter came early that year, causing them to have a short growing season. This caused them to not have enough food to last them through the winter. A group of 7 men volunteered to get food for the

families. They had a hard choice to make. They could either go 115 miles to the north or 40 miles to the west over a mountain to Parowan. They chose the shorter route and started out with a wagon and 2 oxen, but the snow got too deep and they had to walk. They were sinking to their knees with each step, so that made their progress slow and arduous. Each of them had a quilt rolled up and tucked under his arm for his bed roll. By accident, they discovered that when they stood on their quilts they didn't sink into the snow as far. They decided to lay out their quilts, walked on them, pick them up and throw it out again. This is how they made it up over the mountain pass to Parowan to get food and flour for their families. This event is celebrated every June in Panguitch, Utah, and is called "The Quilt Walk." The picture is a beautiful statue in Panguitch of the event.


