As a pattern designer and illustrator for over 20 years, I specialize in animal themes with both pieced and appliquéd blocks. My quilts are unique, lively, and happy with a subtle sense of humor. I create animals with personality over realism.

Color balance (makes a quilt "sing!") is a concept I teach rather than color wheel theory. I find this is a less mathematical and more accessible

way for many of us to think about quilt colors. My students also learn to create dramatic movement with images running over, under, and through blocks and borders. I believe in using the right pieces instead of the most pieces when it comes to appliqué and creating designs with inventive construction and surprises which enhance the beauty and success of any piece.

My work has appeared in national magazines, books, calendars, and catalogs, and at AQS, Quilt Market, Quilt Festival, Pacific international, and Road To California shows. Currently, I am working on a line of fabrics with Hoffman California with whom I regularly collaborate for quilt models and new designs.

The Tall Ship Pilgrim block is suitable for a Baltimore Album quilt, but this one has a secret... It is all fused! Learn great techniques for this quilt method of appliqué. Lyn will teach her favorite tricks for keeping a hand appliqué look to your fused blocks along with some wonderful info on how to control your machine around those curves and points. And that border! Wait til you see how easy it is! The finished quilt is 33" square.

Every two years, Surfside Quilters Guild offers a Challenge. One buys a packet with three beautiful Hoffman fabrics, gets an idea and sets to work...or not.

Sometimes the Challenge theme and fabrics delight us and the quilt makes itself. Well, sort of.

Then there are times when one is left high and dry—no ideas come. Today, with the advent of the computer, we have “goggle” to help spark ideas.

Also, there is Pinterest, Instagram, and quilting books and magazines one can study. Or maybe you can just use the Challenge fabrics in a quilt pattern that you already want to make...your design does not have to be an original one, you know.

Personally, I like to design humorous quilts. One of my two favorite Challenge quilts features a computer that ATE the Y2K. Remember all the paranoia that surrounded that date? Now that was a most satisfying quilt (*Much Ado About Nothing* - May 1999) to create as I was SICK of all the doom and gloom predicted.

My second favorite Challenge quilt is more personal. After I got divorced in 1995, people kept asking, “*When will you start dating again?*” At that time, there were some hilarious personals in the Penny Saver magazine and I had a lot of fun creating a work that included some of those absolutely ridiculous ads.

In that quilt (*Attack of the Double Wedding Ring* - April 1997) I also included a fabric written with the marriage vows as well as the traditional double wedding ring pattern—torn apart, of course. It was truly a fun, over-the-top quilt to make and helped me make light of a tough time.

I look forward to the Challenge this year. I’m always a bit surprised by what comes out of my brain. I hope you’ll get involved too!

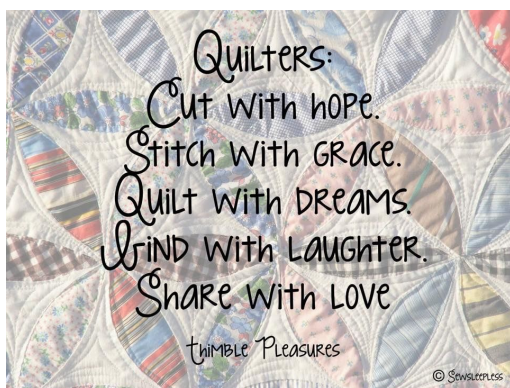

Thanks to Mary Arter who organized this project.

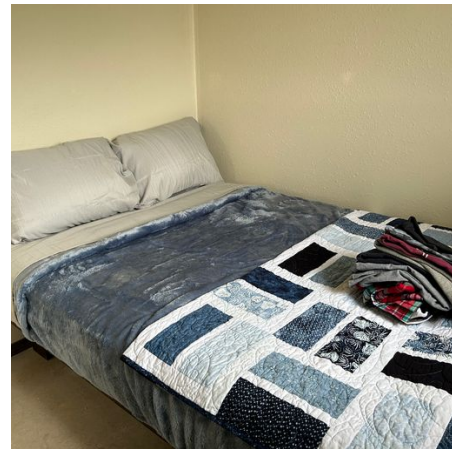
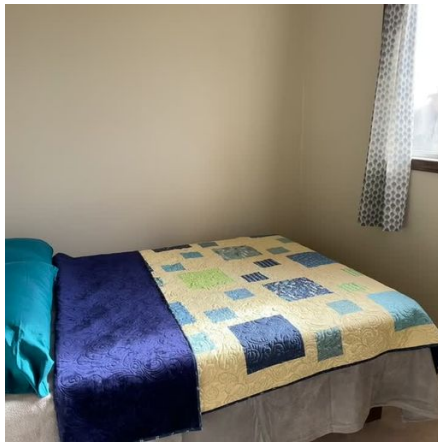

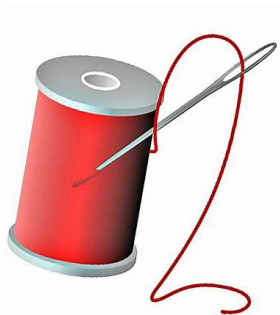

2023 Surfside Challenge

"How Sweet It Is" will be the theme of this year's SQG Challenge.

So...what's SWEET to you?

There is Home Sweet Home and a Sweet Spot on a softball. There are Sweet Dreams, Sweet 16 Parties, and that old Sweet Tooth that gets one in trouble with the scale. Revenge is Sweet and so are stories that are Short and Sweet.

For more ideas, "goggle" the phrase on your phone or computer.

Hoffman has Sweetly donated three fabrics to be used in small or large quantities in your entry. The green might be useful in leaves, trees or monsters. The turquoise blue with fun flecks is perfect for sky, water and sweetly singing the blues. The colorful dot brings in a touch of whimsy, texture or Necco Wafers! Let your imagination run wild or let them play sweetly together with as many other fabrics as you please! Below are the official rules and the preliminary award list.

Instructions

The Kit

Each participant must be a Surfside Quilters Guild member and must purchase a challenge kit. The kit costs \$20 and includes three fat quarters of challenge fabrics.

There will be 60 kits available for sale at the March thru June meetings on a first come, first served basis, one per member.

The Rules

- Challenge entries can be a wall-sized quilt, garment, or decorative item.
- The perimeter of a quilt entry **MUST** measure at least 48" but may not exceed 144."
- You must use the equivalent of a 4x4 inch piece of one challenge fabric of your choice and a 2x2 inch piece of each of the remaining challenge fabrics, visible on the front of your entry excluding the binding.
- You may add as many other fabrics and/or embellishments to your entry as you wish.
- The "Sweet" charm included in the kit must be sewn on the front of your entry.
- Original designs are not a requirement.

All entries must have a label on the back with the title of the entry and the name of the maker.

- Sleeves are not required as quilts will be pinned for display.
- Submission of the challenge entry gives permission for the entry to be photographed and for that photograph to be included in the newsletter and/or other medium.

The Deadline

All challenge entries will be due by the July 11, 2023 meeting.

Judging and Awards

All entries will be judged prior to the August 8 meeting for special awards. Entries will also be judged for a Viewer's Choice award of \$100 at the August meeting.
