



Baby 36"x54"


Afghan/Lap 54"x72"



Stars and Strips Blocks **CORRECTION**

Pinwheel



Using your preferred method for making half-square triangles, make the following for each block:

- 8---Blue/Gold 3 1/2" half-square triangles.
- 4---Red/Gold 3 1/2" half-square triangles.
- 4---Gold 3 1/2" squares.

Sew blocks together using this diagram




Strip Block



Each strip set will make 3- 12 1/2" blocks.

- 3---Gold strips 2 1/2" x 40"
- 2---Red strips 2 1/2" x 40"
- 1---Blue strips 2 1/2" x 40"

Join 3 Gold's, 2 Reds, and 1 Blue strips as shown in diagram. From this strip set, cut 3--- 12 1/2" - wide segments.




