Plant Impressions: Leaf Prints on Paper and Fabric Wednesday, July 12

Description:

Plant Impressions are prints of leaves on fabric or paper. The leaves are layered with the paper and fabric, bound and boiled. The images left behind are created by the tannins and dyes in the leaves. It is a fun process that produces unexpected prints that can be used in a variety of ways. In this workshop we will make a batch of leaf prints. The process will be explained and the students will layout leaves on pieces of fabric and paper.

During the lunch break the batches will be boiled. After lunch we will unveil our treasures. The students will experience the entire process. Each student will take home a small batch of prints.

Bring your ideas and any fabric you want to use to make your project.

In June, Deanne Meidell and Holly Betz will take over our work day. Deanne will demonstrate using fabric and Mod Podge to cover flower pots. Holly Betz will demonstrate covering glass plates with a similar technique. I'm very excited about this. It's something I have always wanted to do. More info to follow as time gets closer.

In July, Julie Kemmerer, one of our newest members will take over our workshop with ideas for Christmas ornaments and stocking stuffers. She is the nicest person you will ever meet. She is kind and sweet, Surfside is so lucky, as am I, as she is helping me immensely with the Boutique.

In August, Elizabeth Geer, will lead our workshop with great ideas to make for our pets: toys, leashes, scarves, etc. which were great sellers at our last Boutique.

"How Sweet It Is"

Join the "sweet" ride! Challenge yourself to show how sweet you feel about something or somebody! If nothing sweet appeals to you, just make an entry with another theme. There are 13 kits left for purchase for \$20 which includes



three fat quarters of Hoffman fabrics as well as a "sweet" charm and a Sweetart to get you started. Your entry can be a quilt, a pillow, a table runner, a 12" x 12" hot pad, or something original you've created. Your entry isn't due until the July SQG meeting so you have plenty of time.

Sweet dreams as you sew!

The Rules

Challenge entries can be a wall-sized quilt, garment, or decorative item.

The perimeter of a quilt entry MUST measure at least 48" but may not exceed 144." You must use the equivalent of a 4x4 inch piece of one challenge fabric of your choice and a 2x2 inch piece of each of the remaining challenge fabrics, visible on the front of your entry excluding the binding.

You may add as many other fabrics and/or embellishments to your entry as you wish.

The "Sweet" charm included in the kit must be sewn on the front of your entry.

Original designs are not a requirement.

All entries must have a label on the back: Title of the Entry and Name of the Maker.

Sleeves are not required as quilts will be pinned for display.

Submission of the challenge entry gives permission for the entry to be photographed and for that photograph to be included in the newsletter and/or other medium.

Ribbons will be awarded for such categories as:

Best Interpretation of the Theme - Best Original Design
Best Use of a Traditional block - Best Non-quilt Entry
Best Use of Challenge Fabrics - Best Use of Embellishments
Best Hand Applique - Best Machine Applique
Best Hand Quilting - Best Machine Quilting by entrant
Most Humorous - Hoffman's Choice - Viewer's Choice

The Deadline

All challenge entries will be due by the July 11, 2023 meeting.

Judging and Awards

All entries will be judged prior to the August 8 meeting for special awards. Entries will also be judged for a Viewer's Choice award of \$100 at the August meeting.




