Thread Sketching and Thread Painting Combined With Nancy Prince Wednesday, June 11, 2025

9:30 AM to 3:30 PM, Gloria Dei Lutheran Church (Dana Point)



Description: This workshop introduces you to both thread painting and thread sketching. A preprinted design easily guides you through each step to assure your success right from the start. You will be amazed at how straight and zigzag stitches create magic right before your eyes. Plus, the process is easy and great fun.

Kit: You will buy a kit from Nancy for \$29, which includes 2 printed designs on stabilizer and 2 pieces of stabilizer backing.






HILLSIDE HOUSES 2025-2026

You can build your own hillside in one of three sizes: a 60" x 70" throw, a 30" x 37" wall hanging, or a 15 x 18" mini quilt. There will be 18 houses divided into 12 individual blocks. Please reference the pattern to help with the shading and transitioning between houses. A coloring page is included to help plan your design. Fat quarters or scraps are recommended for the two smaller sizes. This design was a free QAL on Instagram offered by Pretty Little Quilts in 2015.

Things you need to know:


- Each letter for the pieces represents a certain size block. They will be repeated for the left and right sides of the house.
- House numbers (ex. House #1) is on a coloring sheet available in PDF format on my blog.
- Right sides together is (RST)
- When cutting your squeres in helf to make helf-squere triangles (hists), seve any tettover halves for future blocks.
- Square assembled hat to:
 "5 1/2in sq (throw size)
 "3in sq (wall-hanging size)

 - *** 1 3/4in sq (mini size)

Window Units:

To make one window unit, sow an (I) to each of the short sides of (E). Then sew a (D) to each of the sides of both (f) pieces. Press open

Make 2 for the left side of the house, and 2 for the right side. (4 total).




Roof:


To make the roof, gather and arrange your (F) hists and (G) pieces. Notice that House \$8 is on the upper left side of the roof, and House #4 is on the upper right side.

After you have arranged your places, start assembling your hsts. Sew two hats (RSTs) along the diagonal edge. Press open and square to ", ", or ""



Sew (F) and (G) pieces together to create the roof






Door:

Sew an (H) to each side of (J). Press.



Assembly:

Assemble the left and right sides of the house. Sew the two sides together. Sew the roof to the top.
