This Cathy Van Bruggen Designs quilt, "Shades of Fall", was made by **Joan Orris** in 2011. It was purchased as a kit, but required additional fabric for the half square triangles. The hand applique was done with Cathy's needle turn technique. The machine quilting includes stitch in the ditch, stippling and straight line stitching. She loves this colorful quilt and it hangs in her entryway for two months each fall.



"Quilt for Evelyn" made by **Hiroko Moriwaki** for her great-niece, Evelyn. She usually likes to back baby quilts with Minky fabric, but when she saw the fleece it was meant to be on the back of this quilt. It's a perfect match with the front flannel panel. Machine quilted.



**Carolie Malenius** showed her Star Wars quilt. Her granddaughter brought two Star Wars fabrics this summer and asked me to make her a quilt. **Carolie** added a few more fabrics and this is the result. She usually just slaps a plain backing fabric, but this time she found a panel and planned the very special back.



**Bette Bradley** showed her quilt made from a 1930 pattern and 1930's fabric from her stash. She made the quilt in 2008 and colored it with crayons long before the current crayon craze. Outline embroidery with crayon filling.



"Halloween Parties" was shown by **Monica Shafer**. She used a Bird Brain Designs pattern. Started two years ago, then she let it sit, just needing a binding. When she found it this year she hurried to vind it so she could use it on her table. Hand embroidered, machine pieced, hand quilted.

Matchstick quilting, machine applied fused letter shadows, machine quilted.

Each of the members chose an animal and made two of each to make a small version of the quilt. This pattern is currently seen in many quilt magazines. It will be in the live auction this month.




