Please don't forget to wear your name tag to the next meeting. Someone you know only in passing just might learn your name!





## BLOCK OF THE MONTH - OCTOBER

We continue the no commitment block of the month.

This month we are making a radiating block in the colors of the garden, plus solid white, sewn on a newsprint foundation. If you like, bring in your block or blocks to turn in at the October meeting. One person will win all the turned in blocks. Please note that the block to be turned in is made up of four radiating sections.

The parts of this block can be used in differing combinations. They can look like a climbing vine or swirl around the center. See what you can do with them!

PAPER FANS - A twist on a traditional fan block using improvisational foundation piecing. To make one block of 4 fans you will need:

4 6 1/2" squares of newsprint paper, folded on diagonal & opened

16 1" x width of fabric strips of cotton fabric, in colors of gardens, cut into 10" segments, varied colors in lights & darks

4 - 2" white squares, solid cotton fabric

4 - 1" X 10" white strips, solid cotton fabric

Neutral cotton thread, stitch length set shorter than normal

>Using one newsprint square creased along the diagonal, place one white 1" x 10" strip over the fold, centering and pinning, right side up. Fabrics are longer than the newsprint edges, and are trimmed to the block shape after piecing.


>Place a colored 10" fabric strip face down on top the white strip. Starting at the right edge, using 1/4" seam and sewing through the paper as well, sew a couple of stitches, then bring the top strip across the white strip, so at the bottom edge of the paper you can see slightly less than 1/4" of the white. Continue sewing 1/4" seam, using the right edge of the top strip as a guide. Press open to the right. Repeat with colored strips to the right, starting by matching the top edges, and then moving the top strip so the bottom strip shows slightly less than 1/2" at the papers bottom edge, until you have covered half the square in a fan pattern.

>Turn the square 180 degrees, so the uncovered paper is to the right of the centered white strip. This side is worked the opposite from the first half, from small to large. Place a 10" fabric strip on the white center strip, face down, overlapping the white by slightly less than 1/4", sew a couple of stitches, and bring the colored strip across the white strip so at the bottom edge of the paper, the strips are even. Sew 1/4" seam. Press open to the right. Repeat, sewing colored strips to the right, over slightly less than 1/2" to the left on the top and matching at the bottom, covering paper.

>Trim fan to 6 1/2" square, keeping white centered. Press. Remove paper.



Hawaiian Postcard - **Charlotte Runyan** made this for her ten year old granddaughter, Mia. There are 40 different fabric prints from three islands, 100 blocks 3.5"x5.5" (like an old postcard). Mia helped arrange the blocks. **Charlotte** decided to make a half size block for the pillow sham. She took a machine quilting class last year and decided to use what she learned to quilt this on her home machine. She practiced on the sham and spent too much time quilting small circles. She used larger circles for the quilt and it took her about eight hours to quilt it. She started the quilt in July and had it finished in August.

They recently found **Elizabeth's** card at Joanne's and commissioned her to make the quilt. It is an easy pattern that worked perfectly to show off the wonderful turtle motif.



Alaska Birds - **Carol Whiteside** She bought the kit by Pearl P. Pereira in 2014 at Road2CA, intending it for her daughter, SIL and granddaughter. She was inspired by their love of Alaska as all these designs are from Alaska flora and fauna. Her daughter worked summers in Alaska during college and full time there for 3 years after graduation. This will be a Christmas gift.



"Have a Seat" - **Connie Veldkamp**. In July she bought Cindy Cooksey's pattern and happened to have 9 samples of upholstery fabric which worked just great. She had fun adding adornments and will probably still add a dog, cat, phone, remote to the chairs before she is finished.



Whack-A-Doodle - **Holly Betz** This is a four-patch stack and whack using an Alexander Henry print. Chartreuse is Holly's new neutral. Machine quilted by Vivien Hawker.



Retreat Bags - **Ursula Hartunian** From a free download at [emmelinebags.com](http://emmelinebags.com) It is The Retreat Bag 2.0 and the frame is available on the site. It is also available for less at Quilt Cupboard. Ursula added the straps. She likes to use batiks or animal prints. The red one is an early gift for her daughter's birthday.


