# **October Program - Sherri Peltier**



Hanne (Mama) Lohde's love for stitching began at the age of five, sitting on the floor of her mother's sewing room. While her mom worked on a summer dress, little Hanne stitched a tiny dress for her doll—and she's been stitching ever since.

As a teen, she created much of her own clothing and even sold her knitwear during college. Over the years, stitching, storytelling, and designing by hand have become not just creative outlets, but lifelong sources of joy and relaxation.



In 2020, during the quiet of the pandemic, Hanne brought her long-held dream to life: she designed her very first wool story quilt and founded **Mama Lohde**—a creative studio built on sharing the magic of slow stitching, wool appliqué and thread-based storytelling. Since then, she has been teaching her special embroidery techniques to other stitchers in her Open Stitch with Mama Lohde classes as well as teaching at retreats nationally and overseas. She has won many awards and recognitions of her unique work.

In 2023, Hanne also became a published author with her children's book, *Bubbles*—a whimsical tale rooted in her love for

storytelling and endangered sea life. She lives in Southern California with her family and beloved dogs and continues to design, teach, and inspire others to create from the heart—one stitch at a time.

**Description:** Come join Mama Lohde for a fun and creative workshop where you'll make your very own *Blooming Needle Keeper Book*! In this class, you'll learn essential wool appliqué techniques and be introduced to **32 beautiful and unique embroidery stitches**.

We'll cover both basic and advanced stitches, including:

Chain Stitch, Knotted Chain Stitch, Back Stitch, Pekinese Stitch, Berry Stitch, Closed Fly Stitch, Colonial Knot, Drizzle Stitch, Threaded Back Stitch, Pistil Stitch, Buttonhole Stitch, Straight Stitch, Lazy Daisy—and many more!

**Kit:** You will purchase the kit directly from Hanne (Mama) Lohde for \$35. Kit includes:

- Hand-dyed wools
- Full patterns

### From Our Own Nancy Ota...

#### **NANCY OTA PATTERNS**

Sewing was the necessity that became a passion. After we returned from the internment camps following WWII, my talented Mother, a trained tailor made our clothes by cutting out photos in the newspaper and copying the designs. During the lean years it was a way to make my own clothing and

clothing for my family.

In the eighties, I was embroidering shirts, making clothing and quilts as gifts for various family celebrations. Someone told me about Orange County Quilters Guild. That first meeting got me hooked. The President was Del Thomas, the walls had show and tell, there was a library, and various functions to learn and become involved.

Suzanne Stanton was teaching quilting at the Adult Education school in San Juan Capistrano. She taught me everything from drafting to efficient ways to create quilts. A friendship group grew out of those classmates. After driving to Orange for guild meetings, we decided we needed a guild in south OC. In 1992 we created Beach Cities Quilters Guild. As we aged and retired, we created a day guild, Surfside Quilters Guild.

Along the way, I taught various quilt techniques at Leah's Fabric Gallery and then to quilt guilds in California and Arizona. I created various things to teach, I started a pattern business. My son Chris helped with the diagrams. Friends generously tested my instructions and suggested ways to improve the patterns. Judy Yamazaki returned from Japan for a visit and brought with her a bag using a see through mesh bag. This fabric was not available here, but someone suggested using screen that was available at the hardware store. We began making bags out of this mesh. My "Screen Play" pattern developed. In the past 24 years I have sold over 121,000 patterns. My patterns include bags, quilts, and sashiko patterns.

I retired from working as a dental hygienist at 70 and from traveling with trunk shows and teaching quilting at 80. But, I remain addicted to quilting and still pack and ship patterns. Our recent endeavor is to sell digital patterns online. My patterns are available to download and print.

Flying Geese Quilters Guild David Taylor Workshop "Humming Bird" Appliqué Sunday, October 12, 2025

### 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. Orange Quilt Bee

Flying Geese Quilters Guild is inviting Surfside members to participate in a workshop, "Humming Bird" Applique with David Taylor, Sunday, October 12, from 10 a.m.- 4 p.m.

David Taylor is renowned for his fabric-based art quilts that closely resemble paintings. His process—using layered freezer paper templates, expert color placement, and meticulous hand stitching—allows guilters to create vibrant, realistic wildlife scenes.

This one-day "Hummingbird" class provides a hands-on opportunity to learn his award-winning technique in detail.

A kit is required for this class which costs \$30. The kit includes all pre-washed fabric needed for the block, fat-quarter background, pattern, full-color instructions, freezer-paper templates and tracing paper for placement guide.

You don't have to bring your sewing machine or choose fabrics. All you need is a few items which you probably have at home.

\$50 for the class + \$30 for the kit = \$80
