If you can find 100% cotton clothesline (I've heard they have it at Lowe's) that would be most helpful as I have only been able to purchase enough to make 5 bowls and I hear these are big sellers.





## MONTH THREE



### FABRIC FUN PATCHWORK TABLE RUNNER - MONTH THREE BASKET # 1

finished size 8 inches — unfinished size is 8 1/2 inches  
(s/a=seam allowance)

We are ready to start our first basket which is fun and easy to do. I hope you have started on the table runner but if you haven't it is still easy to catch up. The directions for the previous two months are in past newsletters for you to reference. [EDITOR: I am unable to put the full size pattern in the newsletter]

**Google jillily YouTube and click on "applique the jillily way by jillily" to view a freezer paper appliqué method**

**\*\*Choose your method of appliqué and be sure to read through the directions before beginning the basket\*\*** Make a template of the patterns with freezer paper or cardboard.

**NOTE: If doing freezer paper or needle turn cut a 3/16-1/4 s/a around the entire template. Basket pieces # 1 and #2 the s/a will be tucked under the basket piece #3 at the dashed line. If fusing, cut the fabric even with the template except for basket piece #1 and #2. On those two pieces add s/a at the dashed lines that will then be tucked under basket piece #3.**

**Basket:** Cut the large basket piece out of medium/dark fabric and the smaller piece out of a light fabric. For needle turn method, turn under the entire basket piece #3. (refer to NOTE before cutting. Cut as advised for your appliqué method)

**Handle:** Cut the handle out of one of the basket fabrics. Place flowers 4a,4b,4c in a left to right order.

**Leaves:** Cut 4 leaves out of green fabric.

**Background fabric:** Find the center by folding the 9 inch square in quarters and finger press lightly for placement lines. If using **freezer paper method**, position prepared pieces on the square in numerical order by following the pattern photo. Tack down with washable glue. Be sure to leave an equal margin on all sides. If using the **fusing method**, iron your prepared pieces onto the background fabric in numerical order leaving equal margin on all sides.


**\*\*For either method tuck the handle and piece #2 under the basket piece #3.\*\***

Applique pieces using your chosen method. If **fusing**, tack down edges using a buttonhole stitch or small zigzag stitch.

Trim the block to 8 1/2 inches.

**Instructions for embroidery will be given later.**


**Mary Freedman** showed Christmas Packages. Her group made one in bright colors for Fest and she wanted to see how it looked in traditional fabrics.






